

#### Premature Baby Hat Pattern for Class 43

Please use either Baby Double Knitting or 100% Cotton 3<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> mm (UK size 10) needles

Cast on 48 (56) sts. Knit 6 rows. Continue in stocking stitch until work measures 2 ½ (3) inches – 6 (7.5) cm. Knit 2 together knit 6 – repeat to end of row. Next and every alternate row purl to end Continue decreasing i.e. knit 2 together knit 5 (4) (3) (2) (1) until 12 (14) stitches remain. Purl one row. Knit 2 together 6 (8) times Thread wool through remaining stitches and fasten off. Sew up using a flat seam.

The hats will be collected after the show and taken to Crosshouse Hospital. If you would like to make additional hats we would be happy to take them to Crosshouse too, just bring them along to the show.





- 6. The hall will be open on Friday 6<sup>th</sup> September from 6pm to 8pm and from 9am to 10am on the morning of the show (7<sup>th</sup> September 2019) for exhibits to be staged. Staging cards are to be collected and paid for on arrival. Please ensure that you allow yourself sufficient time to stage your entries as the hall will be cleared at 10am ready for judging to take place. No further exhibits will be accepted after this time.
- 7. We reserve the right to refuse any entry.
- 8. Entries of cut flowers in the Flower Section must be displayed in the vases provided. Paper plates will be provided and must be used for entries in the Baking Section.
- 9. When staging entries the steward's instructions must be followed.
- 10. Competitors are responsible for ensuring staging cards are filled in correctly and placed face down with their entries.
- 11. Prize money will be distributed after the presentation of prizes is complete.
- 12. The judges' decision is final.
- 13. We cannot accept responsibility for any loss or damage to exhibits.
