7	 a) BCIC DR reported no meeting had been held since the previous CC meeting. LH reported a slight delay in drawing up plans due to the unfortunate disappearance of the surveyor for the car park. Once Ross Mackay Architects have completed the plans, these will be shown to the community for comments/approval. DR had discussed with the Head Teacher of Barrhill PS the proposals for the former gate in the school wall to be re-opened, and the formation of an eco garden. These ideas had met with a favourable response. SAC would have to approve any ideas, as would the community. b) Carrick Futures (CF) LH had little to report from CF; as stated at the last meeting the AGM had taken place at the second attempt.
