Bringing Fibre broadband to Barrhill

Did you know that hundreds of communities are already benefiting from superfast broadband via partnering with BT?

The BT Community Fibre Partnership Scheme is designed and committed to working with communities to find a fibre solution. If a village isn't covered in an existing fibre upgrade plan, BT will help find a solution to bring fibre to that area. There usually needs to be a joint funding arrangement, where BT cover the costs in line with their commercial model used throughout the country and the community has the option to self-fund the remaining gap. Shameful behavior of some dog owners

Dog fouling is not only deeply unpleasant, it is dangerous. On behalf of the community, who voted and AGREED to make Arnsheen Park 'dog free' - we respectfully request all dog owners refrain from taking dogs into the Park.

Yet again, we have been told of dogs entering and fouling the Park. We take picking up after our dogs very seriously in Barrhill. Everyone is held accountable for picking up after their pets and we, as a community, help enforce this policy. If this issue remains a problem, owners allowing this to happen could face a fine and no-one wants it to come to that. Arnsheen Park is used by old and young alike—and whilst rare, contact with dog excrement can cause toxocariasis—a nasty infection. Keep our Park safe and secure—no dogs please.
