1	Apologies for Absence	
	Andrew Clegg (AC) (Treasurer), Pearl McGibbon (PMcG)	
2	Police	
	PC Woodley was welcomed to the meeting and gave his report. The figures were from the	
	period between 19 <sup>th</sup> September and 17 <sup>th</sup> October only and were as follows: Concern for	
	person 1; Planned shoots 6; Road Traffic Incidents 2; and Fraud 1. No crimes were recorded.	
	There were no questions for SW and he was thanked for his report and then left the meeting.	
3	Presentation: SP Energy Networks	
	Proposed Stranoch & Chirmorie Windfarms OHL Connections	
ľ	KMcL welcomed the team from SP Energy Networks (SPEN) and Ramboll. Brendan Tinney	
	then introduced his colleagues to the meeting. BT commenced the presentation on the	
	routeing study of the proposed grid connection by stating that SPEN is obliged under Section 9 of the Electricity Act 1989 'to develop and maintain an efficient and economic supply of	
	electricity transmission ' etc. Mark Hill substation was selected as the best location for	
	connection, rather than construct a new sub-station. The aim was to identify a proposed	
	alignment that was economically viable and technically feasible, causing the least disturbance	
	to the environment. BT went through the Methodology, with the application of the 'Holford	
	Rules' to inform routeing, and the Study Area, which was defined by 'high amenity' constraints.	
ľ	Alternative Routes BT and CMac went through the various stages (commencing March	
	2017) in the consultation process, with Stage 4, Confirmation of Proposed Alignment, now	
	ongoing. Indicative visualisations were shown.	
ľ	The rejection of the route through Arecleoch Forest was queried, which was due to objections	
	from Forestry & Land Scotland, leading to comments that while the objections of Government	
ľ	bodies are listened to, those from the general public are ignored.	
	ACk asked when the plans would be submitted –June/July 2020. BT confirmed that SPEN will	
	consult as to where the poles will be placed, with comments made that SPEN should pay for	
ľ	the line to be placed underground.	
	Questions were invited from all and a robust discussion then ensued. Costs of an overhead	
ľ	line versus underground were raised. It was noted that permission has yet to be given for the	
ľ	proposed Mark Hill sub-station extension. The meeting was informed that its views should be made known to the firm and to OFGEN	
ľ	and MSPs. ACk will contact Jeane Freeman regarding this. It was recognised that until the	ACk
ľ	plans have been submitted objections will be on hold.	ACK
	The officials from SPEN and Ramboll were then thanked for their presentation and left the	
ľ	meeting at approx. 8.15pm	
	ACk then informed the meeting of his preliminary discussions with SAC Planning Department,	
ľ	the advice from this being noted.	
4	Minutes of Previous Meeting of 28 <sup>th</sup> August, 2019	
	Incl. Survey Letter-drop	
	These were approved: proposed by RH, seconded by KMcL,	
5	Matters Arising from the Minutes	
	Item 4: Matters Arising: Litter: ACk informed that anti-litter signs will soon be sent to Barrhill.	

	He, too, had found Paul Dougall of SAC's Waste Management, difficult to track down.	
	Car Park Litter Bin: This had now been replaced, although the old lid had been left in situ.	
	CS had received information from two residents that there are now two dog waste bins at the	
	entrance to Arnsheen Park and requesting that one be moved up The Avenue to the	
	crossroads at the Bowling Green. ACk will contact Waste Management.	ACk
	Toby Cover outside No. 53, Main Street: Still outstanding- ACk will again chase this up.	ACk
	View line at Duisk Bridge: Noted that this has finally been done by someone.	
	Sign for WCs: BCIC have revisited this matter.	
	Road Sweeper: This finally arrived in the village on 9th October but the results were	
	questioned as debris was left at the roadside. ACk informed that ARA still await their new	
	machine, which would be more efficient, and once it has arrived the full road sweeping service	
	will be resumed. It was noted that the <b>Drains</b> have still to be cleared. A resident reported that	
	when the grass verges are cut the clippings get into the drains and cause blockage.	ACk
	Item 5: Proposed Arecleoch Windfarm Extension: The neutral letter to the Energy	
	Consents Unit had been sent as discussed, after the CC had approved the contents.	
	Regarding the availability of access to the information in the Memorial Hall when the hall is not	
	open when expected, JT informed that the BDT/BCIC's arrangement with Creetown Initiative	
	is such that a replacement need not be sent to Barrhill when Amy has to cancel. Noted	
	<i>Survey:</i> AC and CS had confirmed, as expected, that any survey carried out had to be done	
	by the CC without external help. The survey had now been undertaken, after the letter to be	
	sent was approved by email, to ascertain present views on further windfarm expansions and	
	on the proposed OHL. The closing date for returns is 2 <sup>nd</sup> November. It had been sent to160	
	households in total, with more than half hand delivered. CS thanked those members who had	
	assisted with this. So far 57 households (74 residents) had responded and there are still a few	
	days left before the deadline on Saturday. Of these, so far 45 households are opposed to all	
	future windfarm developments and want the OHL to be placed underground.	
	In view of the clear results to date it was agreed that a letter of objection should now be	
	submitted to the Energy Consents Unit, as the notice for the proposed Arecleoch windfarm	
	Extension stated that 'Ministers may consider' late representations. Letter to be circulated to	CS
	members before submitting,	00
	Item 11: AOB: Quay Zone Leisure Passes: JT informed that only one resident had	
	contacted Amy regarding this. No further action will be taken at this time. Noted.	
	<i>Martyrs' Tomb Path</i> : It was noted that the overgrown grass had now been cut. While the	
	landowner had agreed to allow a small machine onto the land, in order to eliminate the boggy	
	areas, a local resident, Martin Rennie, was willing to undertake alternative work himself to	
	solve the problem without resorting to machinery. He informed the meeting that he had	
	received funding from the BCIC to purchase wood, which had now been delivered, and he	
	hoped to carry out the work next month to restore the path, digging out drains and creating	
	boardwalks to cover the boggy areas. His offer was much appreciated by all.

•	Copies of AC's report were circulated, which CS ran through in AC's absence at the Carrick	
	Futures AGM. The current CC balance in the bank remains at £721.12. After payment of the	
	small grants awarded at the CC'S August meeting, and if tonight's grant applications are all

	a) BCIC: JT reported on the latest meeting, which included the following items:	
	<b>Trout Inn:</b> The second stage application results have been announced, with the BDT successful in its application for this funding, which was welcomed.

	competition. <b>Califer</b> The Revelue Club is holding a Califer on Saturday 20 <sup>th</sup> Nevember	
	<b>Ceilidh</b> : The Bowling Club is holding a Ceilidh on Saturday 30 <sup>th</sup> November.	
	<b>Defibrillator:</b> One is to be purchased for the Memorial Hall.	
	<i>Hearing Loop</i> : This system will soon be installed in the Memorial Hall.	
	1 <sup>st</sup> Aid Course: This course, which includes CPR training, will be held soon.	
	<b>Barrhill Bowling Club Clubhouse:</b> There is a consultation shortly on the plans for this.	
	<b>Ownership of Public Toilets</b> – RE enquired if this had been settled—still to be finalised.	
	b) Carrick Futures: AC was unable to attend the recent meeting, but had informed that it was	

	a funding round, with a large number of awards being made. These included £10K towards	
	costs for a Development Officer for Barr Parish Development Company; £5K of £10K	
	requested from the SWSCRP for a Development Officer; and £7k for Ballantrae Trust	
	towards the Food Festival expenses.	
	Re-Barrhill Station Car Park – it was mentioned that Network Rail, which owns the land,	
	has only given the SWSCRP a 15 year lease.	
	c) South Ayrshire Health & Social Care Partnership Locality Planning: CS had not	
	attended the September or October meetings. Included in the minutes for 11 <sup>th</sup> September	
	were the following: <i>Participatory Budgeting</i> – an initial sum of £10K had been agreed,	
	which may increase with use of the Integrated Car Fund. Maximum per application is £1K	
	and will be decided at a Market Place event in Girvan in early December (now fixed for	
	Saturday 7 <sup>th</sup> ); <i>Power of Attorney Day</i> to be held on 20 <sup>th</sup> November; Girvan Fire Station	
	• / • •	
	have agreed to the <i>defibrillator</i> being placed outside of their building; <i>Carers' Day</i> on 8 <sup>th</sup>	
	November; Boots Chemist have levied a £5 Community Prescription Charge for delivery	
	in the area—this is being contested.	
	To date, no minutes of the 9 <sup>th</sup> October meeting have been received, but the agenda	
	contained the various usual updates.	
	d) Kilgallioch Community Benefit Company: AC had been unable to attend the last KCBC	
	meeting, which was a funding round, but forwarded the information that a £20,000 grant	
1	application from the SWS Community Rail Partnership had been approved to a 2 <sup>nd</sup> stage	
1	application, conditional on it passing the next stage, towards the creation of a Car Park at	
	Barrhill Station. There were no other applications in South Ayrshire.	
8	Planning Applications	
	W/e 4/10: Laigh Drumlamford: Application for change of use of agricultural land for the siting of	
	4 glamping pods, ancillary works including car park and footpaths.	
	Decisions Lists: August – Application to modify the minute of agreement (Section 75)	
	planning permission for Sunnyside. This was refused. <b>September</b> – Chirmorie Windfarm Ltd:	
	Application under Section 36c of Electricity Act 1989 from Chirmorie Windfarm Ltd, requesting	
	Scottish ministers vary the existing Section 36 consent to construct and operate Chirmorie	
	wind generating station. This was permitted.	
	It was noted there were no comments from the circulation of SAC's <i>Local Development Plan</i>	
	<b>2</b> ( <i>PLDP2</i> ). There appeared to be nothing specific to Barrhill but ACk informed that PLDP2 is	
	more flexible than the original, with the aim of encouraging families to settle in the areas.

-	i) Barrhill Short Mat Bowls Mrs E. McLaren had submitted this application for £280 for the	
	hire of the Memorial Hall for weekly short-mat bowls. This was unanimously approved.	
	ii) Barrhill Christmas Craft Show Linda Wild submitted this for funding costs of £305.50 to	
	hold a Christmas Craft Show on 7 <sup>th</sup> December. Costs included hire of the Memorial Hall,	
	administration and catering costs. CS had clarified points with the applicant after queries	
	were received regarding the application. A discussion ensued regarding the items budgeted	
	for with some members expressing concerns that it would not be possible to obtain a full	
	set of receipts. A vote was taken resulting in 3 in favour of approving the application and 2

	against. The grant was therefore approved, with CS to inform the applicant that all available	CS
	receipts must be obtained to satisfy Carrick Futures criteria.	
	<b>iii) Barrhill Keep Fit Class (SCCD)</b> CS declared an interest in this item, being an SCCD	
	committee member. The sum of £230 was requested for the hall hire costs between	
40	July 2019 and May 2020. This was unanimously approved by the other members.

11	<ul> <li>AOB Council Members/Members of the Public</li> <li>SAC: Phase 2 of Community Council Consultation: It is hoped all members will read this document prior to the next CC meeting, which is before the deadline of 18<sup>th</sup> December.</li> <li><i>Kildonan Gates:</i> CS had been contacted by 2 residents following reports that the owner of Kildonan intended locking entrance gates at both ends of the estate. New gates had been installed at the north end but so far remain unlocked, as do the south gates. SAC's Access Officer had also been in contact after receiving a resident's complaint. Should the gates be locked, Rachel Shipley will contact the owner but at present no action can be taken.</li> <li><i>Meeting on 30<sup>th</sup> September:</i> KMcL, CS and RE had attended a meeting at Barrhill called by a resident of the Barrhill CC area, which was also attended by representatives of several neighbouring CCs and Straiton. Concerns had been expressed at the proliferation of so many planned windfarm extensions/new windfarms in the Carrick area.</li> <li><i>Remembrance Sunday:</i> ACk confirmed that the plan for the 4G all-weather pitch at Girvan had received approval and a petition will be put to the Sheriff for permission to install this.</li> <li><i>CF Director:</i> RE expressed his willingness to become a director of Carrick Futures to fill the vacant post. CS will inform Foundation Scotland</li> <li><i>U28 Dornal Road:</i> RH reported pooling of water on sections of this road, which is hazardous in icy weather. It is the result of forestry drainage being carried out, with water running onto the road adjacent to the Carrick Mill roadend.
